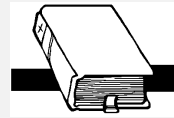

First Reading: Proverbs 8: 22-31

The 'Year for Priests' is coming to an end on August 6, the Feast of Saint John Vianney, patron of all priests; today, on this Memorial Day, we honor all living military chaplains - and pay special tribute to all deceased priests and all religious women and men of all faiths who risked their life - or even gave their life - to minister to our great servicemen and women.

I had the honor of attending the dedication and blessing the Route #3 Bridge in memory of US Army Chaplain Charles J. Watters. After his ordination in 1953, he served in his home town of Rutherford, here at Saint Mary Church. In 1962, he became a chaplain in the Air National Guard and entered active duty as an Army chaplain. In 1967, he completed his 12 month tour in Vietnam and voluntarily extended his service by 6 months. On November 19, 1967, Charles Joseph Watters received the Medal of Honor as he was involved with close combat with the enemy. He was killed while helping care for the wounded. Please continue to pray for Father Watters and all those who risk their lives daily to defend us and our great country of America.

Every inch of land on Earth belongs to a Catholic Diocese and is placed under the local bishop's spiritual care – just as every speck of American soil [in the 50 States] is under some Governor's jurisdiction. But there is one special diocese that does not have 'borders' per se; it is formed by all those Catholics who, rather than living in the same area, serve in a common force ... and that is the Military Ordinariate of United States of America.

The Military Ordinariate or 'M.O.' [technically "Vicariate Apostolic of Military, USA"] was erected on September 8, 1957, to serve the spiritual needs of all the men and women in the armed forces, wherever they are stationed. For years it was overseen by the Archbishop of New York; the military was treated like another borough under his care. In 1985 Pope John Paul II made it its own 'diocese' with its 'headquarters' in Washington, D.C. It does not have its own cathedral, nor does it have its own priests! Only its Archbishop [currently the Most Rev. Timothy Broglio who was a Diocese of Cleveland priest] and his auxiliary or assistant bishops] are 'assigned' to the Military Vicariate; all its priests are 'on loan' from their 'home' Diocese or Religious Order. How does a priest become a

military chaplain? What do they do? How are they different from ordinary parish priests? First, some numbers about the M.O.:

The M.O. provides all the Catholic military men, women and their children with the Church's full range of pastoral ministries and spiritual services. It does this in more than 220 installations in 29 countries, for patients in 153 V.A. Medical Centers, for all US Military Academies, and for federal employees serving overseas in 134 countries and in all US territories. Numerically, it is responsible for more than 1.5 million men, women, and children! There are about 285 Roman Catholic priests in active military duty, and about 242 priests serving as chaplains in VA hospitals.

Military chaplains provide spiritual and emotional support and guidance to a 'parish' of thousands of mostly young men and women who are often transferred on average every three years! Unlike 'parish priests' who minister in their own churches and offices, military chaplains celebrate Mass and the sacraments, counsel and give witness wherever their people are: in a desert tent, on the deck of an aircraft carrier, under the sea in a submarine, in the barracks on base, on a fire-fighting line, in the VA hospital, in the halls of the Pentagon. They provide comfort and hope, inspiration and sacramental grace to those who have accepted the challenge to protect their fellow Americans.

A priest cannot serve in the military until he is released to do so by his Bishop or Abbot, usually for a set term of just 3 years; he must first be certified or endorsed by the M.O. he is then a commissioned military officer of the USA. He is assigned by the Office of the Chief of Chaplains of whatever branch of the US military he serves. Since the US government owns all military chapels or religious institutions, rather than the M.O., all sacramental records are kept at its headquarters in Washington, D.C. – there are currently 2.5 million records of sacraments performed on military installations!

Finally, the M.O. receives no funding from the U.S. Government; it is solely funded by the generosity of its chaplains, men and women in uniform and private benefactors. To learn more go to their website: www.milarch.org Pray for all priests, especially all military chaplains!
